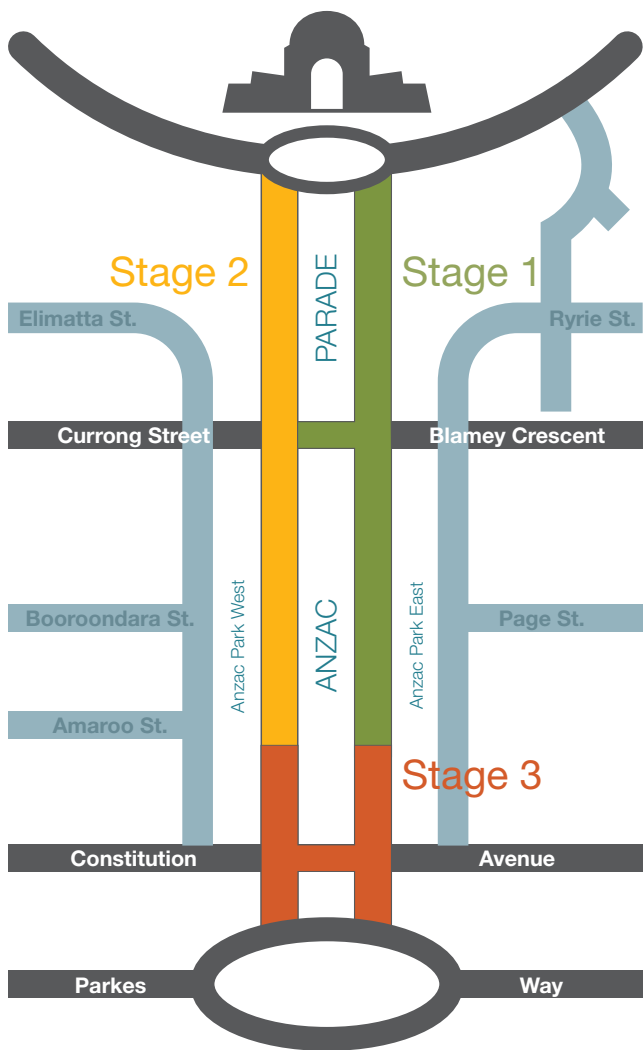

ANZAC PARADE PAVEMENT RECONSTRUCTION



Anzac Parade will undergo a full depth road reconstruction over the next three years by the Australian Government.

The work will be completed in three separate stages. Each stage will occur from November to the following April.

Stage 1

November 2008 to April 2009

Stage 2

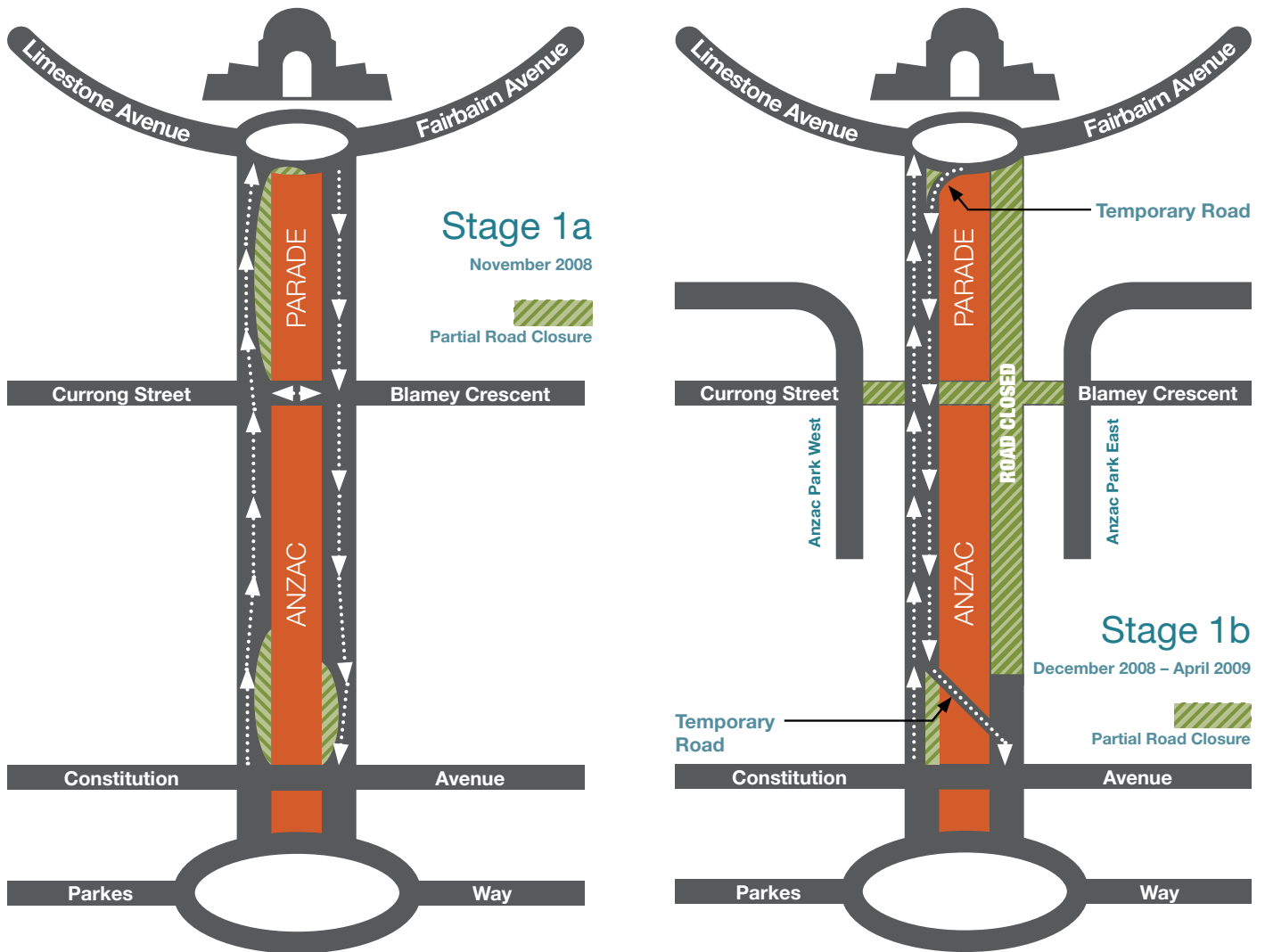
November 2009 to April 2010

Stage 3

November 2010 to April 2011

The National Capital Authority will undertake the first stage of work between 12 November 2008 to 24 April 2009, with the road on the southbound (east) lanes of Anzac Parade being replaced.

The northbound lanes will be made two-way for the duration of stage one, and traffic slowed to accommodate the works.



Dates are indicative

Q: Will Anzac Parade be closed to motorists during stage one of the reconstruction work?

A: Anzac Parade will be open to shared north/south traffic throughout stage one of the work. Concurrently, the intersection of Blamey Crescent, Currong Street and Anzac Parade will be closed to east/west traffic.

Q: What time of day will the work take place?

A: Reconstruction work is programmed to be conducted during the day, from 7am to 4pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 2pm on Saturdays. Traffic will be redirected 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Q: Will the work affect pedestrians and cyclists?

A: Pedestrians and cyclists will be redirected to cross Anzac Parade at either Limestone/Fairbairn Avenue or Constitution Avenue.

Q: Why are the upgrades necessary?

A: This is the first major restoration of Anzac Parade since it was constructed in the 1960s. The existing road is dilapidated and needs to be replaced. This work is essential and every measure has been taken to minimise its impact.

Q: Why is the work being completed in three stages?

A: The work will be completed in three stages to maintain traffic movement, minimise impact on motorists and minimise impact on ceremonial events. Maximum separation of construction and through-traffic is sought to optimise public safety.

Q: How will Anzac Parade fulfil its ceremonial role?

A: The works have been staged to minimise disruption to major ceremonial events. Each stage of the work will begin after Remembrance Day and conclude prior to Anzac Day.

Q: Why is each stage going to take six months to complete?

A: A full depth pavement replacement is to be undertaken. This involves removing and replacing the surface bitumen as well as layers of material found below the bitumen.

Q: How should motorists deal with potential delays?

A: To minimise delays, motorists are encouraged to:

- take alternate routes
- car pool
