

Claim for \$25,000 *Ex-gratia* Payment by a Surviving Spouse

- of a former prisoner of war (POW) of Germany, Italy or their allies, or
- of a civilian detained or interned by Germany, Italy or their allies during World War II

On 8 May 2007 the Australian Government announced that all Australian service personnel who were held prisoner of war (POW) by Germany, Italy or their allies and civilians who were interned or detained by Germany, Italy or their allies will receive an *ex-gratia* payment of \$25,000 in recognition of the unique hardships they suffered.

Before completing this form

POW status was only noted on the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) computer records from 1985 for veterans who were then alive. This means that many war widows eligible for this payment cannot be identified from computer records.

If you are currently receiving a war widows pension and your late spouse was a veteran who was a POW of Germany, Italy or their allies during WWII, you may not have to complete this form.

You should first contact the DVA to check your eligibility from original records by phoning 1800 555 254.

Who is eligible?

This form relates to a person who was alive on 1 January 2007, and they were at one time the widow or widower of:

- a veteran who was a POW of Germany, Italy or their allies between 3 September 1939 and 11 May 1945, or
- a civilian, who was interned or detained by Germany, Italy or their allies between 3 September 1939 and 11 May 1945, and was domiciled in Australia immediately before their detention or internment.

If an eligible widow or widower has died since 1 January 2007 this form should be completed by the executor of the estate.

The veteran's or civilian's death does not have to be due to their captivity. The later marriage or remarriage of the widow or widower does not affect eligibility for this payment. However, a person who was divorced from the veteran or civilian is not their widow or widower and is ineligible to claim.
